CFC has continued to flourish and stand out for its expertise, vision, and cultural traditions, including diversity and community support. CFC creates new possibilities for growth, but the team behind those dreams who put in the work are the ones who led us toward another year of achievement and triumph. Together, we will celebrate in 2023, CFC's 50th anniversary, and we will continue to create new possibilities for growth, innovation, and adventure.











Ketchikan Innovation Hub (KIH) was started to promote socio-economic and cultural development. The new KIH focuses on three key areas for smart community solutions: finding technology and innovative ways to enhance the quality of life for its citizens, building an entrepreneurial ecosystem for start-ups and existing businesses, and developing pilot projects for innovators and entrepreneurs deploying cutting-edge smart community solutions for their business or products.

KIH is part of the Regional Innovation Hub Model for Digital Equity. The hub is designed to serve disadvantaged and underserved communities. These innovation hubs are established with local partners and cities/communities based on three key elements: (1) Geographically Centric (2) Demographically Centric, and (3) Service Centric. There is a digital divide for many rural Alaska areas and Native villages. Alaska's geography, terrain, climate, and vast size create significant obstacles to developing a broadband technology infrastructure which is key to the availability of telehealth, online education, and other advanced technologies. Jointly developed and managed by Cape Fox Corporation (CFC) and Planet Defense LLC, KIH will focus on smart health, cybersecurity, smart tourism, entrepreneurship, workforce development, and job-oriented skills development for the young native population. This is a public-private partnership model where major corporations such as the Virginia Innovation Partnership Corporation (VIPC), Verizon, Amazon Web Services (AWS), and others are already committed. With the right public/private partnerships and funding, KIH will be the center of excellence to further advance our efforts to develop emerging and smart technologies that provide for, strengthen, and enhance our native community. Ultimately, KIH will become a model for all of Alaska.

Throughout 2022, planning and development were the primary focus for KIH by identifying a group of an initial set of projects, including:

Digital Equity for the Under Served Community

In the new digital transformation culture, tribal nations and communities are being left behind, thus creating a significant wealth and prosperity gap. We need a concerted effort to overcome this challenge. federal and state grants are needed to uplift the targeted communities. KIH will play a significant role in achieving this objective in Ketchikan and across Alaska. We expect to conduct targeted, technology-oriented

pilot projects to test and develop new solutions for the tribal community. Eventually, such new solutions will be implemented for smart health, smart schools, technology-based job training for the youth, entrepreneurship to foster new businesses and cybersecurity for local governments and businesses.

Smart Health and Connected Ambulance and Clinics

New technology such as 5G, telemedicine, mobile health clinics and others are be-

coming a powerful force in solving health issues in the tribal community. At large, tribal and native populations have not benefited from improved digital health solutions, and we believe the time is now to forge ahead by integrating these technologies to boost tribal health and wellness. This project will test and develop integrated digital technology solutions for improving the health and wellness of the tribal communities in Ketchikan and other Alaska cities. After the pilot project

is completed, full implementation of digital health technology will take place. Implementing smart digital health solutions will enhance community efforts in providing improved healthcare solutions to the elderly and general population in Ketchikan. Testing and developing 5G, telemedicine, and mobile clinic-based smart health solutions for tribal villages and other communities.

Implementing Ketchikan Smart City through Digital Innovation Hub

Ketchikan is a thriving fishing and tourism destination. The local communities' livelihood is tied to these two dominant com-

mercial activities. Yet, the city is far from embracing new and emerging technology and solutions for creating a dynamic commercial environment. Through the Smart City project, we expect to change the current environment, making Ketchikan a thriving commercial and cultural hub to enhance people's livelihood, quality of life, health, and wellness, and maintain the socio-cultural fabric of society. Increasing tourism through Smart Tourism programs will attract a larger client base for fishing in Ketchikan from the mainland and

globally, help local businesses increase their potential market and client base, and make the community more dynamic by enhancing cultural programs for the tourists and other clients. This Smart City project will increase economic and commercial activities, encourage youth to stay in the community, and establish entrepreneurial businesses, create new job opportunities, increase tourism, etc.

Ultimately, to achieve our goals, KIH will be an essential piece of the larger puzzle. KIH will be able to test, maintain, and manage all the various devices, sensors, and underlying technologies provided by various partners. This will require a transformational approach, meticulous planning, stakeholder involvement, and support from the leaders and governments concerned. KIH will bring into reality the ability for people, businesses, and government in Ketchikan and across Alaska to connect and communicate with one another anytime, anywhere, in an environment of social cohesion and economic development cooperation.

For 2023, one of the first endeavors for the KIH is to bring Smart City technologies to Ketchikan. The VIPC started the Virginia **Smart Community Testbed** in Stafford County, Virginia, which is the home to developing smart technology for the Commonwealth. It is the first Smart City Testbed involving an IoT platform, fully integrated with 5G and other emerging technologies for Smart Cities around the country. Through our partnerships, we will have access to existing case studies and

applications that can be used to advance the mission of the KIH. By working with our strategic partners, we will maintain the native culture while advancing the community into the world of tomorrow by providing easier access to smart and connected healthcare, advanced online education, research, and public safety and many other advanced technologies.

CFFS Graduates from the SBA 8(a) Business Development Program

On December 19, 2022, Cape Fox Facilities Services (CFFS) graduated from the Small Business Administration's 8(a) business development program. The 8(a) program is an essential instrument to financially help economically disadvantaged small businesses gain access to Federal Government contracting. One of the biggest benefits of the 8(a) program to CFFS was the ability to receive sole-source awards. CFFS has many active contracts across a variety of Federal Government customers. At the start of the 8(a) program, CFFS had 43 employees. That number grew to over 760, and to date, we maintain around 320 employees. The 8(a)-contract vehicle is invaluable as an 8(a) business can self-market its capabilities and solutions to a potential government customer to get a set-aside contract without having to openly compete against other businesses. In the 8(a) program, there are limited competitors, who also decrease the field of competition.

Contract News

DHA Application Support Contract

On December 14, 2022, our contract with the Defense Health Agency (DHA) to provide Application Support Services ended. While the Prime contract for the follow-on ultimately was awarded to another ANC, Cape Fox was able to maintain 70% of the workshare through a similarly situated teaming agreement with the new Prime. This started a new strategic partnership and will allow Cape Fox to continue providing IT support to DHA. The subcontract will be with Saxman One, with an effective start of December 23, 2022.
